As wholesale markets policy advisor, you will:

- Develop your knowledge of wholesale electricity markets and business intelligence through daily interactions with industry experts and stakeholders.
- Monitor and analyse legislative and policy developments on wholesale electricity markets and other related areas.
- Contribute to Eurelectric's advocacy for a well-functioning integrated wholesale electricity market as a key driver to deliver a stable and cost-conscious supply of electricity to the industry and individual consumers.
- In particular, contribute to work streams on current energy price increase and its impact wholesale market design, resource adequacy, investment drivers and more generally on the electricity sector.
- Handle working groups and contribute to the preparation of Committee meetings.
- Interact with members to build consensus and develop Eurelectric's positions and policy recommendations on electricity wholesale markets and other energy-related issues.
